Unstoppable: Living the Acts1:8 life

A New Sermon Series on the Book of Acts

Peter's first speech

As we reflect on the first Pentecost, can you imagine the bewilderment and noise, and a scene begging for someone to make sense of it – which the crowd did, brilliantly: ‘Too much wine!’ But one voice refuses the easy explanation.

Without claiming to know everything God is doing, without predicting dates, mapping geopolitics, or making himself the centre, Peter explains how this moment is part of Scripture’s bigger story.

How does an ‘unschooled and ordinary’ fisherman do that? Peter has listened to his world, attentive to what was happening – the wind, the fire, the languages, and their question, ‘What does this mean?’ (2:12). He’s also been listening to God’s word – reaching back to the prophet Joel for Scripture that gives meaning, shape, and hope to the scene – knowing it points to Jesus.

When we wake up feeling overwhelmed and confused, when culture’s shifting faster than we can keep up, when our families and workplaces are in upheaval, when we sense holy ground beneath our feet but dread misreading the moment, when we want to be faithful but the path seems foggy – we’re not in the midst of dramatic scenes, just ordinary moments where we need clarity most. In such times, Peter’s method can become our method – even before we’ve made it out of bed. Armed with the ability to ‘double listen’ to the world around us and the Bible, we can begin to reframe our experience through Scripture’s story.
